Do I Need to Have A Lay Witness Presenter?

It is highly recommended. The use of a lay witness is an effective means of increasing participation. Remember that people give to people. The lay witness presentation provides parishioners with a peer to peer example of why the Catholic Charity Appeal is an important responsibility shared by all members of the diocese. A witness brings into focus, through the sharing of personal examples, how and why support for the Appeal is vital to continue the work of the diocese.

The in-pew method of solicitation can be very effective in soliciting a large percentage of the congregation on a single weekend. We recommend having two in-pew weekends. The first weekend should include a lay witness presentation. The second in-pew weekend will be an opportunity for those who were unable to make a gift during the previous weekend Masses.

It is likely that most of the people who attend Mass on the in-pew weekend will contribute to the Catholic Charity Appeal. It is also likely, in spite of your best efforts to communicate through written appeals, letters, brochures and newsletters that many have either not read the material or have not decided on making their pledge. Inviting a lay witness to speak to the congregation provides unparalleled motivation to participate in the Appeal at that particular moment.

The focus of the Catholic Charity Appeal is serving Christ by serving others. As caretakers of God's gifts, we have been entrusted with what the Lord has provided each of us. As part of that responsibility, it is up to us to provide the means by which the Gospel message of Jesus Christ can be witnessed through the ministries of social justice, Catholic education, religious ministries and spiritual development. The goal of the lay witness should be to share with peers why support of the Appeal is important to you and others.

When recruiting a parishioner to deliver a lay witness presentation, be sure to select someone who is an energetic and enthusiastic speaker. It should also be someone who is a long-standing active parishioner and also a contributor to the Catholic Charity Appeal. This person should feel comfortable with speaking in front of a large audience.

Therefore, we have provided you with yet another resource in the event that you cannot recruit someone for this very important role in promoting the Catholic Charity Appeal. Please refer to the enclosed Lay Witness Speaker Directory as well as some key dates, specifically the two recommended in-pew weekends, for the 2017 Catholic Charity Appeal.

Sample Script of Specific Instructions for the In-pew Solicitation

With your help, we will now implement the in-pew solicitation for the Catholic Charity Appeal. I am going to proceed slowly and I ask for your patience as we do this together as a parish family.

This year, even more parishes have opted to use this method of solicitation. Our giving together as a parish is a sign of our commitment as a member of the Holy Catholic family in Christ.

I won't presume to ask you how much to give. We only ask that we attain 100% parish participation. For some of you, participation may only be filling out the envelope indicating that you are unable to give to the Catholic Charity Appeal this year. Please be as generous as you can when you decide on your gift.

(Use only during second in-pew weekend)

Some of you may have already made your contribution last week or through the Bishop's Partnership in Charity. If this is the case, we ask that you now pray for the success of the Catholic Charity Appeal.

Having said this, let us now begin.

In each pew, you will find a supply of in-pew envelopes along with pencils/pens. If you are sitting at the ends of the pew, please make sure that every parishioner sitting in your pew has what he or she needs.

Clearly print your name, address and telephone number and e-mail address, if you have one, in the appropriate spaces. Please note that your gift will be credited to this parish unless you check the box indicating that you are visiting this parish and would like your gift credited to the parish where you are registered.

Pause 20 seconds

Next, please consider the amount of your gift.

Slow down

Please note that you can make a gift by choosing one of three options.

The <u>first</u> option is to make a pledge with some portion of this amount paid today with the balance billed in accordance with the terms you specify.

Pause 20 seconds

The <u>second</u> option is to make a pledge with no deposit today and spread the payments across the terms you specify.

Pause 20 seconds

We ask that you consider making a pledge versus making a one-time cash gift. If you make a pledge, the Stewardship & Development Office will send you a reminder of the balance due based upon the payment schedule you have selected. If you would prefer to make a regular monthly or quarterly gift by using a credit card or through direct debit, please visit our secure website at www.providencediocese.org. Please remember to check the box on the inside flap of the in-pew envelope to indicate a credit card or direct debit gift.

Pause 20 seconds

The <u>third</u> option is to make a one-time cash gift that will be paid today by cash or check. Make check payable to Catholic Charity Fund. Or, follow the instructions on the form attached to the in-pew envelope to make a one-time credit card or direct debit gift.

Pause 20 seconds

We now ask that you enclose your cash or check and seal the envelope.

Pause 20 seconds

The ushers will now collect your envelopes. On behalf of the thousands of Rhode Islanders in our diocese who benefit from your generosity, I thank you for your patience and for sharing the many blessings bestowed upon you.

Monday, January 23	Catholic Charity Appeal Workshop - this workshop will begin at 4:00pm and end at 5:00pm
Week of January 23	Reminder letter, signed by the Bishop with a pledge card enclosed, will be mailed to all prospects
Friday, February 3	This is the deadline to submit a parish goal review request
Weekends of February 4/5, February 11/12, February 18/19	Parishes are asked to promote responses to the first diocesan direct mail letter as well as the upcoming In-pew weekends through bulletin and pulpit announcements
Friday, February 10	Sign up deadline for the 2017 Catholic Charity Appeal Parish Share Program
Wednesday, March 1	Ash Wednesday - this date marks the unofficial start of the 2017 Catholic Charity Appeal

Weekend of March 11/12	This is the first recommended In-pew Weekend (with a lay witness presentation) for soliciting gifts at your parish
Weekend of March 18/19	This is the second recommended In-pew Weekend for soliciting gifts at your parish
March 20 – April 17	During this time frame, your parish should concentrate on following up with those parishioners who have not responded to your primary method of solicitation
Sunday, April 16	Easter Sunday
Monday, April 17	All in-pew gifts should be submitted for processing

Week of May 1	Reminder letter, signed by the pastor with a pledge card enclosed, will be mailed to all prospects
Monday May 14 - Friday, June 2	Professional Telemarketing Campaign
Week of May 29	LYBUNT (Last Year But Not This Year) mailing sent to all prospects
Friday, June 30	Close of the 2017 Catholic Charity Appeal
